Velita Forte wills to Sonja Thorsen a book entitled, "When and Where to Laugh."


Shirley Curren wills to Beverly White a road map of Padanaram and a duck-hunting license.




## Kindergarten

We learn the alphabet, how to count, how to write our names, but best of all, we pass all our tests and take home our first report card of which we are so very proud.


We learn the names of all of our classmates and in a short time we are all friends and and are having many wonderful times together.

Our friends multiply in quantity and lasting friendships are so very often developed in these early years.



Many of us get band instruments this year and you can hear, "Wow, listen to me play!" "I oughta be on the radio, eh!" "Yeh, so you could be turned off!"




## *Fifth*


Fractions are now coming into our curriculum joy. We learn a lot in fifth grade, but most important, we are a step ahead toward maturity.

This year our homework increases but we keep our noses to the grindstone, as next year we'll need all of the knowledge we can obtain to face those Regents exams.




## *Eighth*






## *Freshmen*
