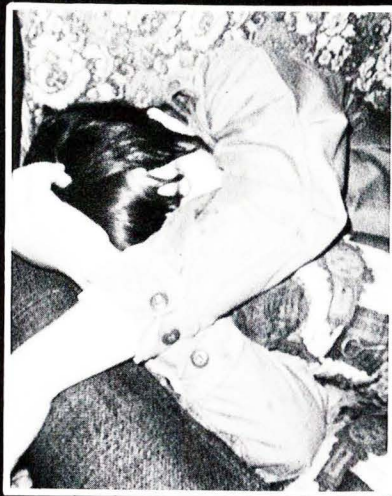
The Senior Class Of 1971

We hope that those of you whom we leave behind, will have as much fun and success as we have had.

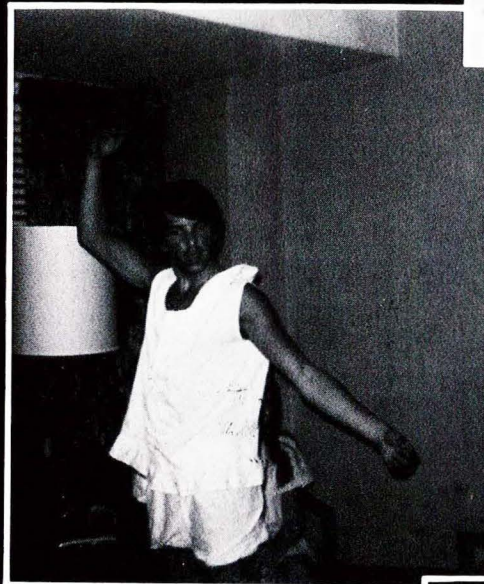

Our Senior Trip To Washington . . .

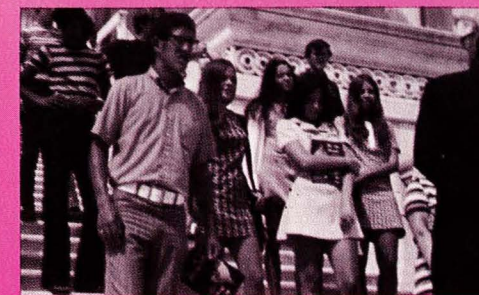
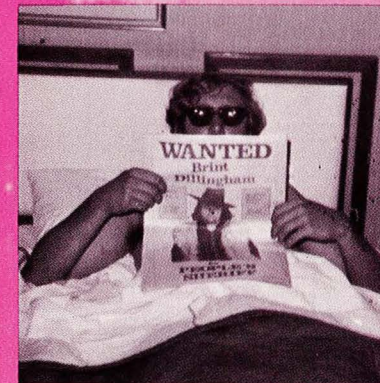
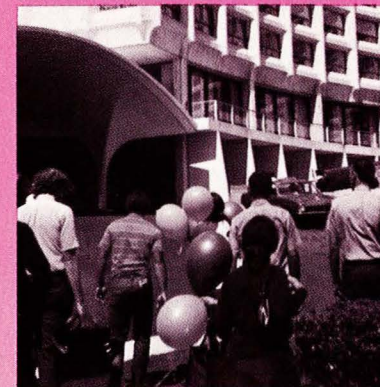
