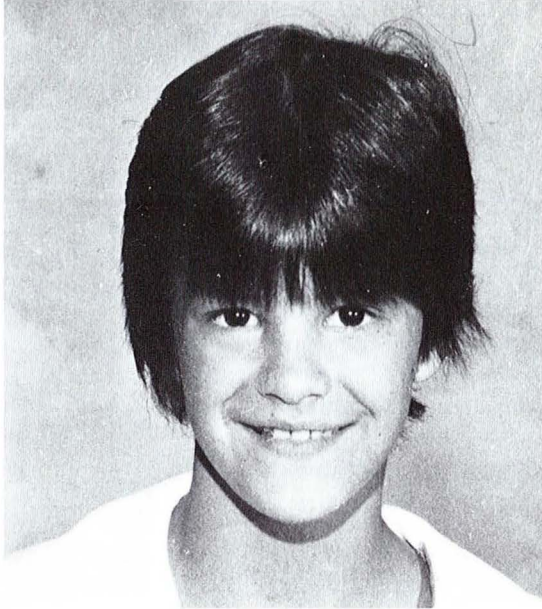

Introduction

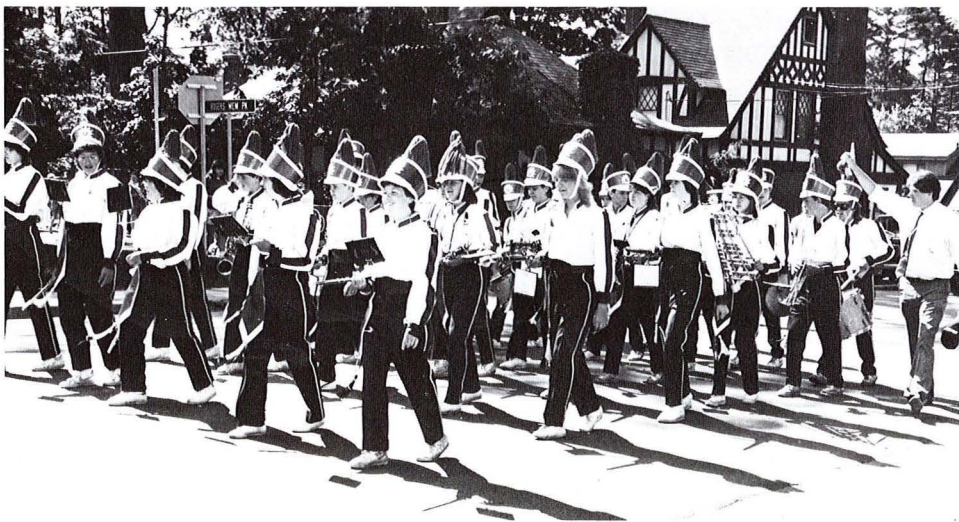
