

# Showing off pirit


Students express their school pride by attending games and participating in school functions.

Many of these special trips and events are highlighted on the following pages. We, the Class of '95, hope you enjoy these photo selections as much as we have enjoyed arranging them!




# Bolton Modified Soccer Team Completes Undefeated League Season

Alison stated in appreciation to all present that she couldn't have accomplished this milestone without the help of all her teammates.


