












# 1996 UNDEFEATED MVAC CHAMPIONS

**Our BCS varsity baseball team** garnered the 1996 Mountain and Valley Conference Championship while recording an undefeated 12-0 league record. The Spring weather played havoc with this season's schedule and limited play to only conference and sectional games. The only blemish on the record of the Eagles was a hard fought 3-2 loss to defending state finalist Lake Placid in the sectionals. That makes Lake Placid the only team to successfully defeat the Eagles over the past two seasons. During that period Bolton has compiled a 29-2 record. This marks the 8th consecutive league title for the Eagles and extends Coach Donahue's league winning streak to over 65 games — a streak that began back during the beginning of the 1989 season.
